Association Agreement.




Figure 2 –General guidelines for the European Green Deal

The European Green Deal is the most comprehensive and ambitious climate and environment protection program launched by the EU. It is a strategy that should transform the EU into a resource-efficient economy where there are no net emissions of greenhouse gases in 2050 and where economic growth is

decoupled from resource use. The reason for that is the rapid climate change due to human-induced increase of greenhouse gases in the 20th century. Ukraine plans to join the agreement; it announced carbon-neutrality by 2060 in its National Economics Strategy. However, for our country such transition can become a huge challenge due to outdated industry technologies, low quality governance and overly ambitious goals prompted to Ukraine by the EU. The European Union has a complex strategy for the Green Deal agreement implementation. This strategy focuses not only on the energy sector, but also on agriculture, transport, sustainable industry and so on (See Fig.2) [2].
